Keeping tabs on KL traffic offenders 24/7

I REFER to the Respect The Law or Hormat Undang-Undang (Op HUU) traffic operation being conducted by the Kuala Lumpur police from June 4 to 15, targeting motorists who commit offences such as illegal parking, causing road obstructions, going through red lights or stop signs, not wearing seat belts or using a mobile phone while driving.
