KEJARA Merit Demerit Point System can effectively Discipline Reckless Drivers and Riders

Drivers Merit Demerit Points System (DMDS) are used successfully by global leaders of road safety to discipline drivers and riders. An effectively run DMDS program is a great enabler for achieving good road safety outcomes.

Whenever a serious road crash happens and traffic enforcement agencies announce details that the driver involved had multiple outstanding traffic summonses the question on everyone's mind is why no action was taken to suspend his drivers license under the KEJARA driver merit demerit point system prior to the crash. Best practise dictates that action on reckless drivers/riders should be both preventive and reactive in nature before and after a road crash occurs to reach desired road safety goals of fatality and injury reduction and also critical safety gaps remedy after the road crash occurrence.

Effective and deterrent disciplinary action on reckless drivers, riders and repeat offenders is a fundamental requirement to help achieve fatality and injury reduction milestones set under the Malaysia Road Safety Plan 2022 – 2030.

If the strong arm of the law is used to discipline drivers and riders compelling them to obey critical traffic regulations such as speed compliance, traffic signals, safe overtaking, safe following distance, as well as road traffic signs and road markings, Malaysia will certainly witness a significant decline in road fatalities and injuries with an effective KEJARA System.

As a long serving advocate for road safety, I am a great believer that an efficiently run system of rewarding good drivers and punishing repeat offenders through an effective KEJARA merit demerit points and driver license suspension system is the best way to govern, transform and change driver behaviour.

Top performing countries for road safety such as Sweden, Norway, United Kingdom, New Zealand, Germany, USA, Australia, Japan all have a efficiently working driver merit demerit system notifying and rewarding good behaviour and punishing reckless drivers and riders with heavy fines as well as driver's license suspension.

Our KEJARA system was first launched in 1997 and revamped in 2017. One of the problems plaguing the effectiveness of the KEJARA system in Malaysia is the lack of integration between traffic summons data of PDRM and JPJ.

During my tenure as MIROS Chairman a new milestone was achieved as PDRM traffic summons data was directly linked to the KEJARA database in JPJ resulting in full consolidation of traffic summons data under the KEJARA database in JPJ. The follow up plan after establishing the vital datal-ink was to refine and integrate PDRM and JPJ data for accuracy and data gaps within a period of 6 months and to have a comprehensive KEJARA database on traffic summons within the set timeframe. Two years have gone by and there does not seem to be significant progress to suspend the 5 to 10 percent repeat offenders and reckless drivers and riders using KEJARA.

Probationary Drivers License (PDL) KEJARA database is working very well as PDL drivers and riders get their license suspended or revoked at 20 demerit points. However, for Competent Drivers Licenses (CDL) drivers and riders the progress of drivers/riders licenses suspension is very slow.

The success of the PDL license suspension program creating a strong deterrence on PDL drivers and riders should serve as the catalyst and role model to revamp and change the current governing structure enabling rapid suspension of CDL driver and rider licenses upon attaining KEJARA demerit point. If we are serious of having an effective and working KEJARA merit demerit points system for CDL drivers or riders licenses we need the successful PDL license KEJARA governing structure to be applied for CDL licenses as well.

Elmina Crash Involving Hawker Beechcraft 390: Insights from a Licensed Aircraft Engineer


The tragic crash of the Hawker Beechcraft 390 in Elmina on 17th August 2023, has concluded with a definitive cause: the accidental deployment of the aircraft's spoilers. For Licensed Aircraft Engineers (LAEs), this finding highlights the intricate nature of aircraft systems and the critical importance of understanding how even a single malfunction can lead to catastrophic consequences.

Spoilers, typically used to reduce lift and assist in descent and landing, are designed to deploy in controlled situations. However, their unintended deployment, especially during critical phases of flight such as takeoff or cruising, can severely disrupt the aircraft's aerodynamics, leading to loss of control. This incident underscores the complexity of modern aircraft systems, where multiple components interact, and a failure in one area can have far-reaching effects.

For LAEs, the report serves as a stark reminder of the importance of rigorous inspection and maintenance routines. While the spoilers themselves might not be a common point of failure, this incident emphasizes the need for thorough system checks and a deep understanding of how different aircraft systems interact. It also highlights the importance of reviewing and understanding incident reports and manufacturer guidelines to stay informed about potential risks.

Furthermore, this tragic event underlines the role of LAEs in ensuring that all safety-critical systems are meticulously inspected and maintained. It also reinforces the necessity for ongoing education and training to keep pace with the complexities of modern aircraft systems.

As the aviation community absorbs the lessons from the Elmina crash, the findings will undoubtedly influence future maintenance practices and enhance the safety protocols that LAEs follow. The ultimate goal remains to prevent such tragedies by ensuring that all aircraft systems operate flawlessly, even in the most challenging conditions.

Visit to Custom Agencies at KLIA Airport Terminal Operator, Akademi Kastam Di Raja Malaysia and Short Course forShipping Agent Certificate

64 students and one lecturer conducted an industry visit to the Customs sector and participated in the Ship Agent Certification training at the Royal Malaysian Customs Department Academy. This visit was fully sponsored by the Maritime Management Student Trust Fund (CILT). The purpose of this visit and the short course was not just to provide students with practical visibility in air forwarding companies and to observe the methods of customs clearance for goods and cargo at the KLIA air cargo terminal, but also to equip them with the skills and knowledge necessary for their future careers.

As a result, students will not only understand how the concepts learned in lectures are applied in the field, but they will also be able to apply these concepts in their respective careers. Furthermore, to ensure that students develop high-level skills, the Customs and Cross-Border Regulations course, which they studied for 14 weeks, will be translated into this short-term training. It will be followed by a mandatory examination for the Ship Agent Certificate, recognized as equivalent to a Bachelor's degree.

It is important to note that this certificate and training have been introduced through this course to Maritime Management students since 2018. Now, Bachelor of Maritime Management program students can apply for positions in Customs and MAQIS (Malaysian Quarantine and Inspection Services) through the Public Service Commission. Graduates of this course have been offered positions in cargo and forwarding companies in the land, air, and sea transportation sectors. On the first day of the visit, the students were taken to two organizations, Dimerco Express Sdn. Bhd and MAS Cargo are both located in the KLIA Cargo Terminal area. The purpose was to expose the students to the operations of air cargo handling and the customs declaration processes carried out by both transport companies. As a result, the students understood the methods and practices of declarations in the aviation sector, which has similarities with the shipping sector.



On the second day, the students were taken to GTR Logistics, a subsidiary of AirAsia that handles cargo operations. GTR is a highly active company in cargo and goods handling operations, consistently practising compliance and integrity with customs declarations. To understand the enforcement of inspections for imported goods related to plants and animals, the students were also brought to the **Malaysian Quarantine and** Inspection Services. The purpose was to expose the students to the enforcement operations and compliance with regulations controlling these goods, ensuring the safety and well-being of imported items at the air border entry points.
