How serious are we about road safety?

As a nation we are famous for giving discounts to traffic offenders who have not settled their summons. This is bad road safety policy. Why?. Traffic offenders summons are issued for violations of Road Traffic Rules and the Highwaycode. Such behaviour causes road crashes, road deaths and injuries. In 2023 number of deaths on our roads was 6433 and 70 % of deaths involved young motorcycle riders. The rule of the thumb is 3 serious injuries for every death. Cost of road crash accident victim treatment is a huge burden to our healthcare system

Our motor insurance industry is burdened by high claims ratio for 3rd pary claims particularly for motorcyclists third party claims. Perkeso payout for compensation for commuting journey road crashes. Lets look at grevious and incriminating data from our Department of Welfare. Of the 680,000 welfare aid recipients from 240 000 are road crash victims. World Bank estimates costs of road crashes to be around 2%-3% of GDP. This means that minimising road crashes can add 2% to GDP growth. One should bear in mind also the grief and pain as well as socio economic disruption caused to families of loved ones lost in road crashes.

Malaysia is a signatory party to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) agenda. Signatory parties such as Malaysia have promised to reduce the absolute number of road deaths by 50% by year 2030. Unfortunately instead of reducing Malaysia's road death figure is increasing year on year. Malaysia has drawn up a road Safety plan called the Malaysia Road Safety Plan 2022 - 2030 designed to reduce the absolute number of road deaths by 50% by year 2030. At the moment based on increasing rate of road deaths Malaysia targets to reduce road deaths by 50% is just a distant dream. If Malaysia is serious about reducing the daily carnage on our roads then our driver and vehicle enforcement and driver education should be following best practise of global road safety leaders with minimal road crashes.

We cannot continue to have a dysfuctional Driver Merit & Demerit system that does not work to suspend reckless and repeat road traffic safety rules violators even when they have 20,30,40 or more traffic offences & only cry wolf when a serious road crash happens (with many fatalites) to announce that the vehicle driver had many outstanding traffic offences. The purpose of an effective law enforcement program on drivers is to serve as a strong deterrence and to instil fear of suspension or loosing their drivers license. The Perception of a Driver getting a traffic summons or suspension of drivers license or being charged in court for serious and non compoundable traffic offences such as reckless driving causing death is a low 30%. In countries which are leaders of road safety the perception of a driver being booked for a traffic offence is close to 100%.

How serious are we about road safety?

Malaysia can join the league of countries with an excellent road safety record such as Norway, Sweden, UK, Japan, Australia, Germany, US etc by improving effectiveness of traffic law enforcement through improving Kejara implementation, introducing more speed and traffic light cameras to curb speeding and traffic light violations, introducing weighing in motion to deter frequent occurance of overloading, stringent action on illegal racing on our roads.

Moreover our riders are taught to ride on the left side of the road but they are riding in fast lanes and lane filtering and lane splitting in blindspot zones of their own angle of vision as well as other drivers angle of vision. This is contributory to the high road crashes deaths and injuries involving our riders. To solve this problem the traffic regulations should be amended to disallow riders below 250cc to ride on fast lanes and to do lane splitting between two traffic lanes or lane filtering between multiple traffic lanes. Difficult to do? Not if the benefits of reducing road crashes and saving lifes is well explained through a collective effort involving MOT , KKR, MKJR , JPJ, PDRM and MIROS. To add momentum to an advocasy and rider education campaign led by above Government agencies enlisting support of the private sector and road safety NGOs is vital

Dato' Chang Kah Loon, FCILT, emphasizes that logistics management is a shared responsibility and calls for collective efforts to create a safer and more efficient supply chain for the betterment of the industry and community. As professional logisticians, the focus is on education, without referencing specific cases unless supported by additional media. Recent images on social media have highlighted potential human negligence, even with established Standard Operating Procedures (SOP). The consistent enforcement of these procedures remains a challenge. Drivers must ensure all locks and securing mechanisms are checked before entering roads. Dato' Chang urges haulage companies, container depots, and traders to implement more thorough checks and safeguards to prevent such incidents, reduce disruptions, and avoid unnecessary dissatisfaction. He also suggests that relevant authorities like APAD and JPJ consider reviewing and addressing these issues proactively.

The recent tragic container overturning accident, which resulted in a fatality, has garnered significant attention. Guang Ming Daily reported on the incident, while Astro AEC News covered it in a live broadcast on 16 November 2024. During the broadcast. Dato' Logistician Chang Kah Loon. FCILT, FLogM, President of The Society of Logisticians Malaysia (LogM) and Chairman of The **Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport** (CILT) Penang Section, emphasized the critical issues surrounding the accident. He highlighted the interconnectedness of every component in the supply chain, from import/export consignments to haulage, road transport, container handling, and workplace SOPs. Dato' Chang called for a thorough investigation to uncover any potential human negligence or lapses in the processes.

He stressed that logistics management is a shared responsibility among all stakeholders and that while safety policies, rules, and SOPs are in place, consistent enforcement and adherence remain significant challenges. Dato' Chang urged all parties to prioritize safety at all times to prevent similar tragedies in the future.

Recent traffic congestion on the Penang Bridge, causing delays of several hours, prompted Dato' Log. Ts. Chang Kah Loon to propose mitigation strategies. He emphasized the need for a fully integrated accident investigation unit, better public transport options like LRT and a feeder bus system, and a focus on "moving people, not cars." He also highlighted the challenge of delayed response times to accidents and suggested utilizing CCTV and road monitoring systems for faster, coordinated responses. While traffic disruptions did not affect local sea and air freight logistics, Dato' Chang stressed the importance of proactive coordination and regular strategy reviews to improve Penang's transport systems.


