Towards a Nation of Safe Drivers and Riders

Mandatory urine and blood tests for PSV and GDL license applicants will reduce the prevalence of substance abuse amongst new applicants and renewals of PSV and GDL licenses. Making these tests compulsory will assist detection of PSV, GDL applicants involved in substance abuse.

Although a urine sample is easier to collect and store and transport compared to a blood sample the downside of urine sampling is the relative ease of sample contamination at the point of obtaining the sample, as well as lack of accurate information on the exact levels to which drug abuse occurred.

Mandatory Blood Tests and Random Checks

Blood samples are best indicators of recent substance abuse as the sample is directly drawn from a patient's arm and labelled and sent to the laboratory for analysis. The tighter control procedure for obtaining a blood sample reduces the danger and risk of sample contamination. Hence making blood tests as a mandatory requirement of new PSV and GDL applications and renewals should be a serious policy consideration by our Government.

Even after enforcing compulsory blood tests for renewal as well as new applicants of PSV GDL licenses the current policy of random checks for detection of substance abuse amongst Truck and Bus drivers should continue. Frequent random checks on drivers is a good deterrent as it will encourage Truck and Bus operators to require contract and replacement drivers to undergo blood tests as a pre-condition to obtain valid PSV/GDL licenses before they are employed.

Mandatory blood tests for new applicants combined with stringent and frequent random checking will definitely help to weed out deployment of unlicensed drivers as happened in a recent Tourist Bus crash at Genting.

Blood Test facilities should be available at all Government Medical Clinics

A policy of compulsory blood tests for PSV and GDL applicants should be supported by availability of blood test facilities at all Government run medical clinics (Klinik Kesihatan) throughout Malaysia to make it convenient for Bus and Lorry Drivers to undergo the proposed mandatory blood tests.

Towards a Nation of Safe Drivers and Riders

There is a lot of hearsay evidence that some private doctors are rubber stamping the current process of medical screening thereby jeopardising the safety of road and public transport users. The Ministry of Health needs to review practise of allowing private clinics to do PSV/GDL medical screening and restrict screening to be done by Government run Klinik Kesihatan only. PSV and GDL drivers are B40 group and they should be supported with blood-testing facility availability at all Government Clinics for their convenience.

Addressing Driver Shortages

In addition to improving the quality and availability of medical screening of truck and bus drivers for substance abuse the acute shortage of drivers and riders needs the attention of our regulatory authorities. Pan Malaysia Bus Operators Associations (PMBOA) and Pan Malaysia Lorry Operators Association (PMLOA) highlighted the issue of acute driver shortages which urgently needs an additional 3500 trained lorry and Bus drivers to address the current shortages.

The Ministry of Human Resources and Ministry of Transport have jointly announced a policy of funding the training of an additional 1000 drivers. Drivers licensed under this program should have a mandatory minimum work period requirement in Malaysia for at least 5 years to ensure they work within the country to address our current Truck and Bus driver shortages.

The call by PMLOA and PMBOA for Government to annually fund PSV and GDL driver training is appropriate to ensure untrained and unlicensed drivers are not driving our Trucks and Busses.





2nd WiLAT Malaysia CILTM Committee Meeting








Highlights of the Event: Breast Cancer Survival Sharing Session
