Message From CILTM President Professor Ts Dr Muhammad Zaly Shah FCILT



In today's globalised economy, the logistics and transportation industries play a crucial role in connecting businesses and facilitating the movement of goods. However, the weakening of Ringgit can have a significant impact on these industries. One of the key effects is the increase in import costs. As import costs increase, businesses may be forced to adjust their pricing and supply chain strategies to accommodate the higher costs. This can lead to higher prices for consumers, disrupted supply chains, and increased pressure on logistics and transportation companies to find cost-effective solutions. Furthermore, weakening RM can also affect the ability of logistics and transportation companies to invest in new technologies, infrastructure, and employee training. Additionally, a weakened RM can also affect the purchasing power of logistics and transportation companies when acquiring fuel, vehicles, and equipment from international markets. This can further strain their operational expenses and potentially lead to a reduction in the efficiency, quality, competitiveness, and reliability of their services.

Overall, the impact of weakening RM on the logistics and transportation industries goes beyond just increased import costs, shaping the operational capabilities, strategic decisions, and long-term sustainability of these vital sectors. Several studies have highlighted the interconnectedness between the logistics industry and regional economic development. For example, studies have shown that a well-developed logistics industry can attract abundant investments and contribute to the overall economic strength of a country.

Addressing the challenges posed by weakening local currencies requires a multifaceted approach, encompassing strategies to mitigate currency risks, enhance operational efficiencies, and foster innovation and productivity within the logistics and transportation industries. Additionally, close monitoring of global economic conditions and proactive adaptation to currency fluctuations are essential to navigate the complexities arising from currency weakening. As a professional body, CILTM and its members must understand the impact of weakening RM on the logistics and transportation industries, as the effects are far-reaching. Therefore, I invite you to work together sharing your experiences and concerns. These are our industries.

Hold owners of truck fleets accountable

THE escalating number of accidents involving truck and trailer drivers on Malaysian highways and major roads is a matter that demands immediate attention and action.

These incidents, resulting in countless deaths, often stem from a critical human factor – the behaviour of drivers, some of whom operate with a rogue and recalcitrant mindset.

On Feb 3, a seven-vehicle crash

On Feb 3, a seven-vehicle crash near Simpang Pulai on the North-South Highway claimed the lives of two trailer truck drivers. The crash resulted in an eight-hour traffic snarl that inflicted substantial economic losses to the nation. It was discovered that the

It was discovered that the driver who was the primary cause of the crash had two outstanding traffic summonses, but he continued to drive under the fleet owner's approval. Furthermore, both trucks lacked a co-driver, a contributing factor to accidents as drivers often drive without adequate rest or sleep. Truck drivers are subject to

Truck drivers are subject to regulations mandating rest after a certain number of driving hours.



Ensuring responsible practices: It is crucial to shift the focus from merely penalising drivers to also holding the owners of truck fleets accountable.

However, the pressure imposed by fleet owners to meet delivery deadlines often results in non-compliance, putting both the drivers and the public at risk. It is crucial to shift the focus

from merely penalising drivers to holding the owners of truck fleets accountable. A recent case in the United States, where a woman and her husband are on trial for involuntary manslaughter after their son went on a deadly shooting spree at a school in Michigan, highlights the importance of charging those who enable negligence.

If the truck driver faces charges, the owner should also be charged. If the current laws do not provide any regulation for holding fleet owners accountable, it is imperative for the govern ment to consider legislative amendments.

The Transport Ministry should also suspend the licences of lorry drivers who have a history of multiple traffic offences.

multiple traffic offences.

It is high time to direct our efforts towards ensuring that truck fleet owners prioritised the safety and well-being of their drivers, thereby safeguarding the lives of countless others on our roads.

By taking swift and comprehensive action against negligent track fleet owners, we can hope to create an environment where responsible practices are not just encouraged but also enforced.

This is not just an issue of individual accountability but a societal imperative to protect lives and ensure the smooth functioning of our transport infrastruc-
